**Essex County holds Used Tire Recycling Day on Saturday**

Essex County residents can take used and unwanted tires to the Essex County Used Tire Recycling Day from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 27 at Essex County Public Works Department, 99 W. Bradford Ave., Cedar Grove.

During the Essex County Used Tire Recycling Day, rubber tires with or without metal rims will be accepted. Rims will not be returned to residents; they will be recycled. The collected tires will be delivered to a state-licensed

transfer waste facility, which will recycle the tires into new uses.

The Essex County Used Tire Recycling Day is for Essex County residents only.

Residents are not charged when they bring materials, but they must provide proof of residency at the site. Commercial businesses may not drop off materials.

**County college offering information sessions for high school students**

County College of Morris (CCM) in Randolph is offering two Saturday Information Sessions and a Scholars Day so high school students and their parents can learn about the range of opportunities to receive a high-quality education and a jump start on college.

Two Saturday Information Sessions are scheduled from 10 a.m. to noon on Oct. 27 and Nov. 17. Those sessions will cover the full selection of associate degree programs, student services, financial aid and scholarships and co-curricular offerings provided at CCM. A tour of the campus with a student ambassador also will be offered.

From 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Thursday, Nov. 8, CCM will host a Scholars Day. At this session, high school stu-

dents and their families can gain information not only on CCM's associate degree and student support programs, but also its Challenger Program for high school students that allows them to earn college credits, the Honors Study program, transfer opportunities to earn a bachelor's degree and NJ STARS, which covers the cost of tuition at New Jersey's community colleges for students who rank in the top 15 percent of their class. CCM student ambassadors will also lead campus tours and join students for lunch provided by the college.

**NJCPA invites students to apply for accounting scholarships**

**ROSELAND** – The New Jersey Society of Certified Public Accountants (NJCPA) is inviting New Jersey high school seniors and accounting majors entering their fourth or fifth year of a New Jersey-based college or university to apply for NJCPA Scholarships.

Applications are open until Monday, Dec. 10, for high school students and Monday, Jan. 7, 2019, for college students.

The NJCPA Scholarship Fund awards \$7,000 scholarships to college-bound New Jersey high school seniors intending to major in accounting or obtain a concentration in accounting. The fund also awards \$6,000

one-year scholarships to accounting students at New Jersey colleges or universities who are currently in their junior year or in their senior year and are entering an accounting-related graduate program.

Scholarships are awarded based on academic performance, a 500-word essay and a personal interview. High school students must be college-bound New Jersey students and have a cumulative three-year grade point average (GPA) of 3.5 or above and a minimum total SAT score of 1260 or a minimum composite ACT score of 26. Among other requirements, college students must be residents of

New Jersey attending a college or university in the state with a minimum 3.2 GPA overall through the end of the fall 2018 semester.

"Nothing is more rewarding than giving back to the younger generation of CPAs. The scholarship program is a great way to connect with these worthy individuals," said Chris Lovasz, certified public accountant, president of the NJCPA Scholarship Fund and managing director at Deloitte.
